Pope Francis believes that, for too long, the Church has been in "self-preservation mode," and now is the time to choose the missionary path in all that we do.

I invite us to commit ourselves anew to the greatest adventure there is... to be Jesus' missionary disciples. I invite us to offer, once again, our prayer, our gifts, and our engagement for the life of the Church.

As you look through this stewardship report, I invite you to say a prayer of thanksgiving for all the great people and great things we are doing at St. Thomas the Apostle. Please reflect in your heart how God might be calling you to be a missionary disciple in these challenging times. I hope you will also take a moment to consider how God has blessed you and how you might make a return of those blessings.

May God continue to bless us and guide us.

The prayer (shown at left), known as the *Suscipe Prayer* by Saint Ignatius, is sung by our choir and is one of my favorite texts. It is a radical prayer of self-giving and openness to God's love. And it illustrates well the stewardship we are all called to in participation of the liturgy.

You have heard many times that liturgy is not a 'spectator's sport'. Liturgy is not done for us. It is us doing for God. The word 'liturgy' or 'leitourgia' comes from two Greek words meaning 'people' and 'work'. Simply understood, liturgy is our shared work, and we are stewards of that work.

What I cherish most about the community of St. Thomas the Apostle, is your wholehearted participation in the work God has called you to. You sing at this parish! Really sing! You are fully active in the rituals of our faith. Our liturgies are life-giving because you give them life.

The celebration of liturgy is a beautiful model for stewardship. As Saint Ignatius reminds us, we are called to empty ourselves of our own wants and needs to enter into something bigger and better. We are called to the celebration of the Paschal Mystery, the life, death, and resurrection of Christ. As Paschal People, we are called to bring our unique talents and treasures, that together create the beauty of our communal experience.

This work requires the love and labor of everyone. It takes the talents of musicians, lectors, preachers, artists, gardeners, and sewers. It takes the time of ushers, greeters, Eucharistic ministers, sacristans, gift bearers, cross bearers, servers, and many laborers to prepare our spaces inside and out seasonally. It takes the treasure of those able to financially sustain our liturgical needs. Above all, it takes the commitment of all of us, the ministry of the assembly. Without you, there would be no celebration of the Mass. From the newborn to the aged, regardless of status, struggles, health, or doubting faith, you are part of us. You have much to offer and when you are away, you are missed. This Lent and throughout this year, consider what has been given to you and what you can return to God.

PLANNED GIVING


These donations are one-time gifts, and we ask you to consider St. Thomas the Apostle as part of your estate planning.


CAPITAL GIVING


This is giving that happens as a result of careful strategic planning and a case study presentation on areas of need and/or facility improvements. i.e., *Mission Critical* in 2018

What is a Financial Stewardship PLEDGE

Each of us has the opportunity again to renew our commitment to one another and the mission of St. Thomas the Apostle by making a financial commitment – a pledge, which is a solemn promise.



Why are annual stewardship pledges important?

Annual pledges support what we do at St. Thomas the Apostle and beyond our doors. Our yearly budget is driven by the generosity of our annual pledges. Each and every pledge makes a difference and works toward the building of our faith community. Knowing what funding to expect, we can plan for the costs of our ministries for the coming year.



How much should I give with an annual stewardship pledge?

Christian stewardship is grounded in the understanding that our standard of giving should reflect our standard of living. The Bible tells us that we should contribute 10% of our income. If this seems unmanageable for you, we suggest you choose another percentage and challenge yourself to grow in your practice of sacrificial stewardship over time.



Do I have to pay at the time I make my stewardship pledge?

Returning your pledge card is a promise to pay. You make your pledge and then fulfill this pledge over as many payments as you wish throughout the year, using offering envelopes or electronic fund transfers.

CONSIDER AUTOMATIC GIVING

More than ever before, the disruptions over the past few years have affirmed the benefits of Electronic Funds Transfer (EFT) – for the parish and for our members.

WHAT ARE THE BENEFITS?

- It will allow you to plan your giving, in the same way you budget other financial considerations.
- You will no longer have to be concerned about catching up on donations when you miss a Mass.
- You will be able to easily adjust the amount of your automated contribution (up and down).
- You will no longer need to write a check or bring cash every week.
- At Mass, you may drop the provided EFT card into the collection basket to represent your contribution.

I have "gone to church" my entire life. I have "worked for the church" in some capacity since I was 16 years old and sat on my first Parish Council. And I have "taught church," in schools and in parishes, for the better part of 38 years. But when I joined the staff of St. Thomas the Apostle in 2005, I started a different kind of faith journey. I still went to church, I worked for the church, and I taught church, but what 20 years of ministry with this faith community brought to my life is a sense of what it means to "*be Church*," to "*be the Gospel*," to "*be Christ*," and to experience the beauty of others being Christ to me. That has been the most profound, most humbling, fullest expression of *Church* that I have ever had, and one for which I am eternally grateful to each of you.

You have shown me my strengths as well as my limitations and weaknesses; you have played an indispensable role in my being a father; and the impact you have had on both Abby's and Meghan's lives cannot be expressed in words. You have been church to me so profoundly that it was here, at an early
